BLEEDING FOR A CAUSE: BLOOD DONATION





- The college boasts a robust system that encourages students to donate blood at nearby medical colleges and hospitals.
- A Blood Donors Forum operates within the college, overseen by two dedicated teachers, to facilitate this noble cause.
- Upon admission, the forum collects blood group information from new students. It also organizes blood identification camps for those whose blood groups are not yet determined.
- Utilizing this data, the forum maintains and regularly updates a comprehensive blood directory, with separate versions available in college hostels.
- Innovative software featuring a UT code system has been developed to efficiently match donors with recipients based on blood type.
- Detailed records of all donors are meticulously kept, and participating students receive attendance relaxations as a form of recognition.
- The forum not only coordinates blood donation drives but also hosts educational sessions with expert speakers to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation.
- Thanks to the Blood Donors Forum, around 500 students annually volunteer to donate blood, significantly aiding emergency patients. This commendable effort has been recognized by local medical colleges and hospitals, which have expressed their gratitude through appreciation letters to the college.
- Students get rid of their fear for blood donation, proud of being a life saver.

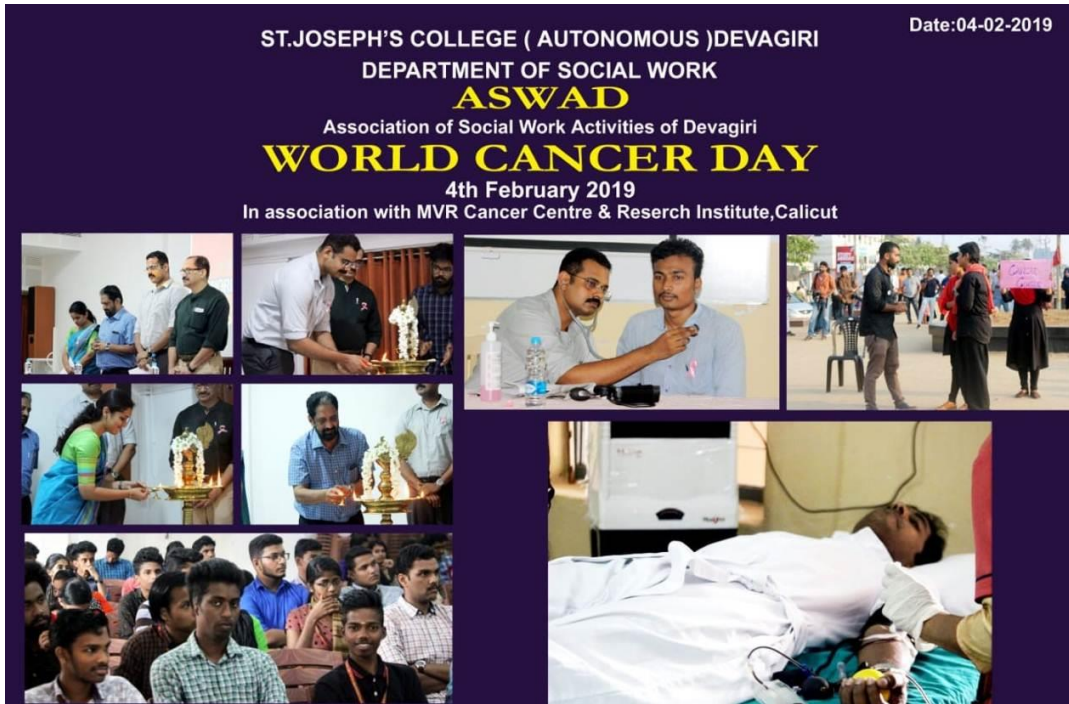

REPORT ON THE BLOOD SCREENING & AWARENESS CLASS AT GOVT. HSS PARAMBIL BAZAR, KOZHIKODE

Encouraging more students to donate blood can help to alleviate blood shortages and ensure that patients have access to the blood products they need. 2022-2023 academic year has met several blood requirements. A community that is willing to donate helped to satisfy the blood requirements. Beside blood donation the club also organised blood screening and awareness class to extend the services to society.

Report on the blood screening & awareness class conducted on 21st June 2022 at Govt. HSS Parambil Bazar, Kozhikode

St. Joseph's College Blood Donation Forum in association with Malabar Hospital, Eranjipalam, conducted medical camp and health awareness talk at Govt. HSS Parambil Bazar, Kozhikode, among the students and the parents on 21st June 2022 from 2pm to 4:30pm. This was the first program conducted by the forum during the academic year 2022-2023.

The camp was inaugurated by Mrs. Deepthi Divakaran, Principal, Govt. HSS Parambil Bazar and was presided by Mr. Santhosh Kumar, PTA President. The awareness class on "Lifestyle diseases and adolescent health" was led by Dr. Sangeetha, MBBS, DGO, Malabar Hospital. Dr. Sangeetha started the session mentioning the importance of the health, later extended to lifestyle diseases- Obesity, PCOD, Cancer. Extra care was given to spread awareness on personal and menstrual hygiene. The session came to an end after doubt clearance. The talk was informative and self-assessing. Students reflected on their eating habits and imbibed the necessity of exercise and staying fit. The crowd was well aware on COVID and the need of getting vaccinated. The one-hour talk covered all major issues that needs to be known by an adolescent. Ms. Sunisha, Psych-social counsellor delivered vote of thanks.

After awareness talk, registration counter was opened for medical camp. The camp was equipped to check blood pressure, glycemc status, and screen blood group.



Students and parents together of 120 in number availed the services of camp. The curiosity of students to know their blood group was a delight to watch. By the end of camp, the satisfaction of serving needy group filled our hearts. The cooperation of school management- PTA and hospital administration made the medical camp successful.

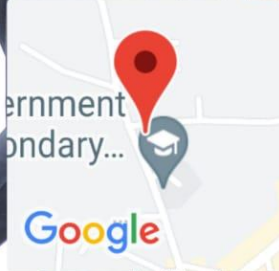
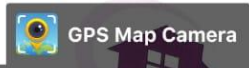

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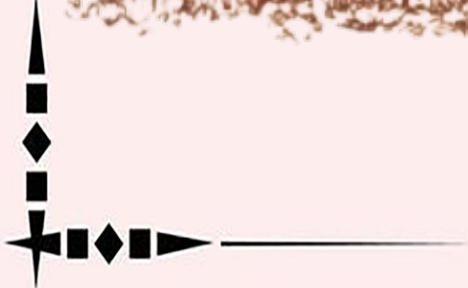


Setting-up of directory containing Blood group details

INTRODUCTION

“Swayampoorna” is an E-literacy campaign conducted with a tie up between **Peruvayal Gramapanchayat and Department of Computer Science, St. Joseph's College, Devagiri.**

The intended social extension activity was to provide awareness to common people about the various e-services provided by the Govt. of Kerala. The Peruvayal Grama panchayat aimed to make the ward members e-literate and make the panchayat first **e-literate Panchayat** in the state of Kerala. It was conducted as several stages and the initial stage commenced on 17th May 2022 and lasted till 31st May 2022.

The Department has assigned Mr.Kanuprasad (Asst. Professor in Computer Science) and Mr. Tegil Joseph John(Asst. Professor in Computer Science) as staff coordinators of the event. Mr Drupad Mohandas (I year BSc CS) was appointed as the student coordinator.

The training sessions were handled by the **first year BCA & B.Sc. CS students of the college.** The students were divided into **12 groups**, each consisting of six to nine members. Each team covered 12 to 15 hours of classes within a span of 3 days divided into two sections each day. Students went to remote locations within different wards of Peruvayal Gramapanchayat and took classes in pre-assigned locations. This interactive session conducted by the students covered various topics such as tax payment, accessibility to various e- Services of the Government, general awareness and exposure to different payment gateways. The people, officials and governing body of Peruvayal Panchayat were very enthusiastic about the whole event and actively participated in the event.

As per the feedback from the attendees which was received after the classes, the whole campaign was a huge success. It helped them to use the e-services more efficiently from the comfort of their house using their smart phones.

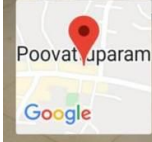

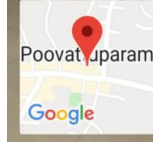

The session began at 10 AM with a welcome speech by **Mr.Tegil Joseph John** (Asst. Prof. in Computer Science). The classes for the trainers were conducted by **Mr. Nithin Raj** (Technical Assistant, Peruvayal Grama Panvchayat) and **Mr Anil Kumar** (Village Officer, Peruvayal Grama Panvchayat).

The topics covered in the session were

- To pay Property tax
- To attain Ownership certificate
- To know the Pension status
- To Familiarize Citizen portal
- To Pay Land tax
- To use Smart Phone
- To transact using various payment Gateways.

Mr. Nithin Raj (Technical Assistant Peruvayal Panchayath) and Mr. Anil Kumar handled the first session and second session respectively. The students interacted with the resource persons actively. 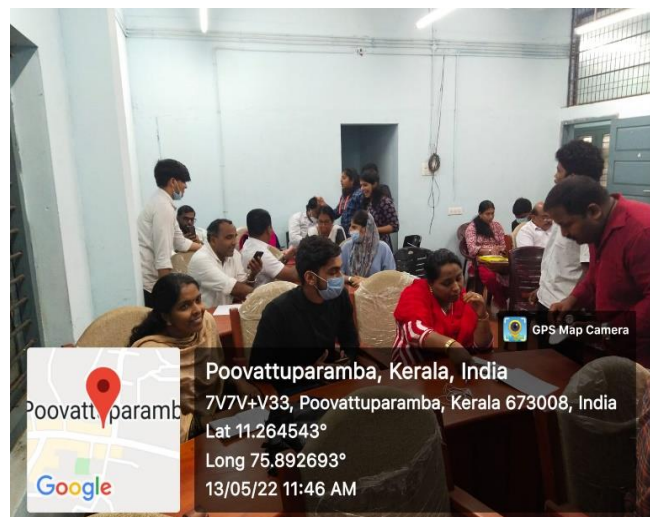
TRAINING SESSION FOR WARD MEMBERS

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Whereas, the sole purpose of this memorandum of understanding is to ensure a comprehensive care and development to the inmates of the welfare homes under the social justice department through cooperation between 1st party and 2nd party via the Happy Hill Project Initiative.

THE HILL PROJECT: An Introduction

In a country like India where family ties are greatly valued, it is the basic unit for providing welfare to its members. Circumstances like poverty, unemployment, mental illness, abandonment, violence, substance abuse, health problems, destitution, exploitation and old age issues have weakened family ties and families have become inadequate in terms of providing care and protection to its members. In such a situation, the State is responsible for ensuring essential care, protection and opportunities for its citizens to ensure the safety and well-being of its people. Welfare programs can be generally termed as the government support for the well-being of people, these programs provide financial aid to individuals or groups who cannot support themselves and helps people to cope with rough periods of their lives. The ultimate goal of welfare is to provide a better standard of living by helping and empowering the underprivileged sections of the society. If these sections of people are not properly taken care of and efforts are not taken to make them self-sufficient, independent, creative and productive. It can be said as the denial of the rights of citizens and also a waste of human resource which is the core strength of any society. A developed nation or welfare state provides “A good present and a better future” for all its citizens.

In Kerala, the Department of Social Justice and its allied agencies are involved in addressing the problems of social security and welfare. The Social Justice Department was established on 9th September 1975 for ensuring justice to the disadvantaged sections of the society for the implementation of social welfare programmes and services in Kerala. On 2017 the Department of Women and Child was established bifurcating the Social Justice Department for ensuring the holistic, physical, psychological, cognitive and emotional developments of Women and Children. There are presently 78 welfare institutions under the aegis of the Social Justice Department (SJD) and Women and Child Department(WCD) for the care, protection and rehabilitation of children, disabled, women and aged. Out of this, 33 institutions are for children, 20 for women, 12 for aged people and 13 for disabled. These social welfare homes provide food, shelter, security and other basic necessities to the inmates of these homes. The major initiatives set up by the government are to support the poor, the developmentally challenged, and other disadvantaged groups. But there has been a growing demand that the approach to social

security programs and schemes should progressively shift to a rights-based framework and should not be viewed merely from a welfare prism.

As a result, the Institutional care of weaker and deprived groups of people form an important area for the social welfare programs of Kerala. As part of this program The District Administration along with the Social Justice, Women and Child Department with the concerned development officers has planned to implement a project called Happy Hill. These activities will be supported by the Happy Hill monitoring committee chaired by District Collector along with the superintendent of welfare homes. Hereafter, all the initiatives will be monitored by the 1st party along with the other committee members.

2. AIM

To provide comprehensive care and development to the inmates through an integrated approach towards empowering the weaker sections, through convergence of existing services, resources, infrastructure and manpower in all-related sectors with the ultimate objective of changing the lives of the ones who are in need of care and protection.

3. OBJECTIVES

1. To understand the requirements and give comprehensive care and support to the inmates of the welfare homes, by collaborating with the reputed educational institutions in Kozhikode.
2. To understand and act upon the needs of the institution like providing vocational training for self-employment and to create comfortable living spaces in welfare homes by tapping CSR potential.

3. To re-integrate the inmates into the community thereby ensuring the rights and dignity of the individual.

4. DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

4.1. First party:



HAPPY HILL PROJECT: An Introduction

In a country like India where family ties are greatly valued, it is the basic unit for providing welfare to its members. Circumstances like poverty, unemployment, mental illness, abandonment, violence, substance abuse, health problems, destitution, exploitation and old age issues have weakened family ties and families have become inadequate in terms of providing care and protection to its members. In such a situation, the State is responsible for ensuring essential care, protection and opportunities for its citizens to ensure the safety and well-being of its

people. Welfare programs can be generally termed as the government support for the well-being of people, these programs provide financial aid to individuals or groups who cannot support themselves and helps people to cope with rough periods of their lives. The ultimate goal of welfare is to provide a better standard of living by helping and empowering the underprivileged sections of the society. If these sections of people are not properly taken care of and efforts are not taken to make them self-sufficient, independent, creative and productive. It can be said as the denial of the rights of citizens and also a waste of human resource which is the core strength of any society. A developed nation or welfare state provides "A good present and a better future" for all its citizens.

In Kerala, the Department of Social Justice and its allied agencies are involved in addressing the problems of social security and welfare. The Social Justice Department was established on 9th September 1975 for ensuring justice to the disadvantaged sections of the society for the implementation of social welfare programmes and services in Kerala. There are presently 78 welfare institutions under the aegis of the Social Justice Department (SJD) for the care, protection and rehabilitation of children, disabled, women and aged. Out of this, 33 institutions are for children, 20 for women, 12 for aged people and 13 for disabled. These social welfare homes provide food, shelter, security and other basic necessities to the inmates of these homes. The major initiatives set up by the government are to support the poor, the developmentally challenged, and other disadvantaged groups. But there has been a growing demand that the approach to social security programs and schemes should progressively shift to a rights based framework and should not be viewed merely from a welfare prism.

As a result, the Institutional care of weaker and deprived groups of people form an important area for the social welfare programs of Kerala. So as part of this programme the district administration along with the district social justice department, women and children consisting of concerned development office has planned to implement a project called Happy Hill project. These activities

will be supported by the Happy Hill monitoring committee chaired by District Collector along with the superintendent, welfare homes. Hereafter, all the initiatives will be monitored by the 1st party along with the other committee members.

AIM

To provide comprehensive care and development to the inmates through an integrated approach towards empowering the weaker sections, through convergence of existing services, resources, infrastructure and manpower in all-related sectors with the ultimate objective of changing the lives of the ones who are in need of care and protection.

OBJECTIVES

1. To understand the requirements and give comprehensive care and support to the inmates of the welfare homes, by collaborating with the reputed educational institutions in Kozhikode.
2. To understand and act upon the needs of the institution like providing vocational training for self-employment and to create comfortable living spaces in welfare homes by tapping CSR potential.
3. To re-integrate the inmates into the community thereby ensuring the rights and dignity of the individual.

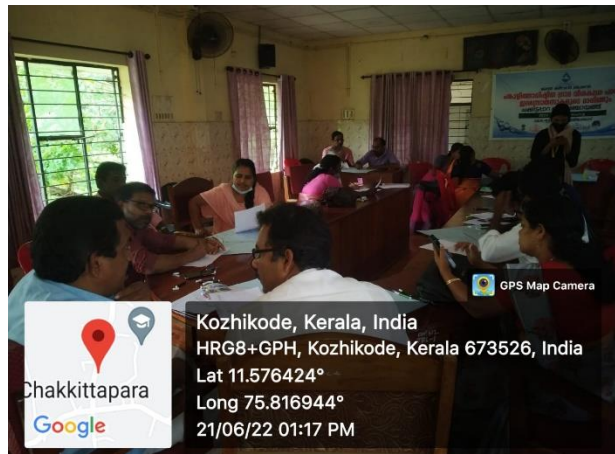
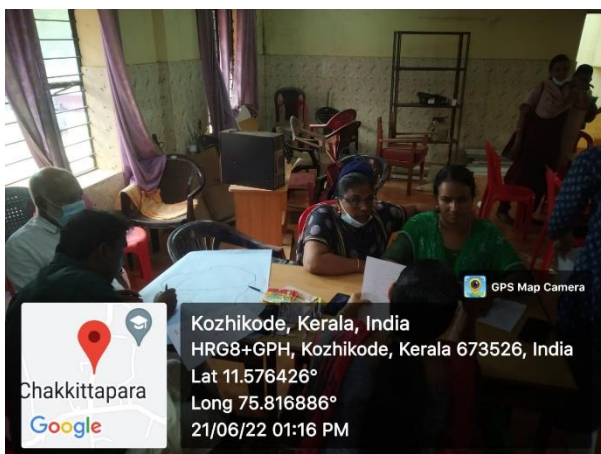
ACTIVITY 1: Water Bodies Mapping

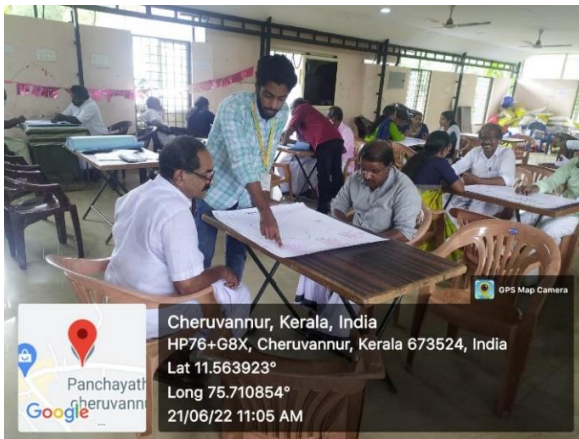
Need of the Activity:

The state water resources department has launched an ambitious project to prepare digital maps of all 44 rivers in the state and feed them on to a geographic information system (GIS)-based platform. The aim is to create remarkable decision support system to develop an integrated, sustainable and long-term water conservation and management plan for the state, which is increasingly vulnerable to droughts and drinking water shortage. So, we decided to participate in this tremendous task.

Brief Description:

The MSW students of the St. Joseph's College, Devagiri have decided to participate in the water resources mapping programme in one of the adopted villages in collaboration with a leading NGO of the Calicut district. The students from the college visited the place Cheruvannur, Kerala on 21st June 2022 and attended a meeting with the Panchayat members and understood the procedures in water resources mapping. After the meeting, the students went to various parts of the village and collected the information related to it.







ACTIVITY 2:

Title of the Activity: WINGS OF HOPE

Need of the Activity:

From the interactions with the panchayat members and from the sum result of the village survey we understood that there is a high dropout rate among students in the tribal community. Therefore, the college has decided to assist tribal students in their journey towards education.

Brief Description:

The Naval NCC Cadets of St. Joseph's College, Devagiri have decided to assist tribal students in their journey towards education. As per the request from the students of the colony of the adopted village, the Naval NCC cadets decided to provide stationery items to the tribal students of Pulpally Panchayat, Thazhekappu Colony.

On 03/07/2022, under the banner of 'WINGS OF HOPE', the Naval NCC Cadets of St. Joseph's College Devagiri visited Thazhekappu colony of Pulpally village in Wayanad and provided school necessities to the students. The ward member of the Panchayat inaugurated the program.

The Cadets along with Social Work coordinator Mr. Alan Joy interacted with the students and had a cultural session. The aim of the project was to provide assistance to those most in need of these. Rates of those attending school regularly is very low among children of the village. We hope that this small effort will motivate these children to attend classes regularly and excel in education.





ACTIVITY 03: Drug abuse campaigns at various places in the adopted villages (29, 30, 31 October and November 01, 2022)

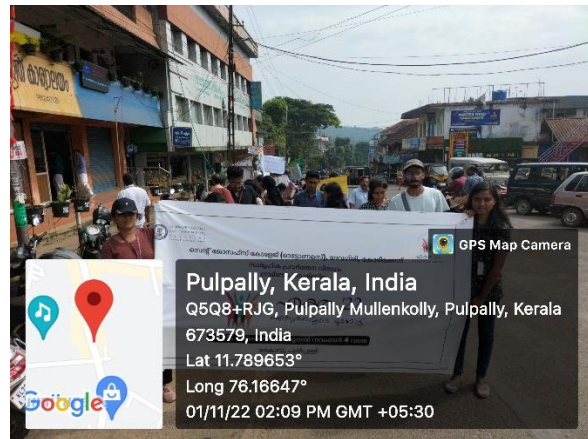
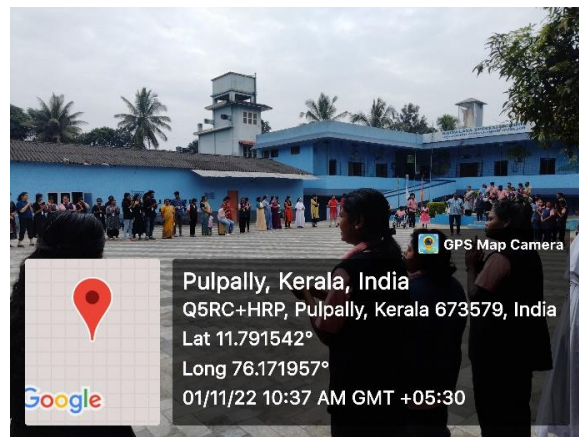
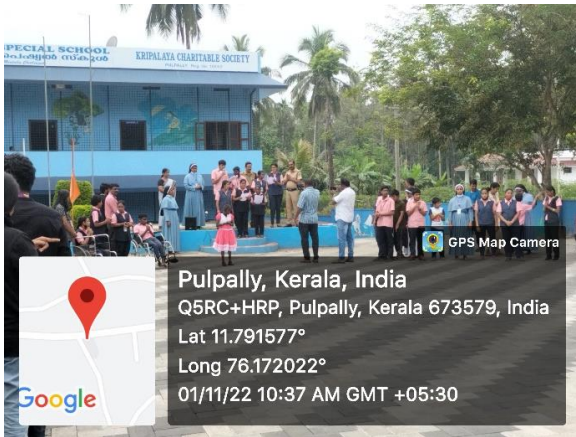
Need of the Activity:

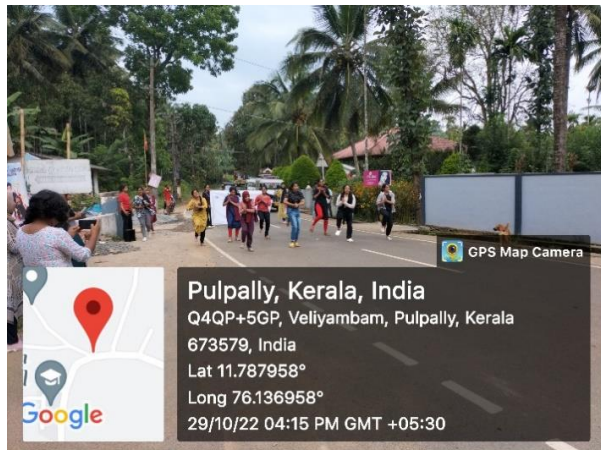
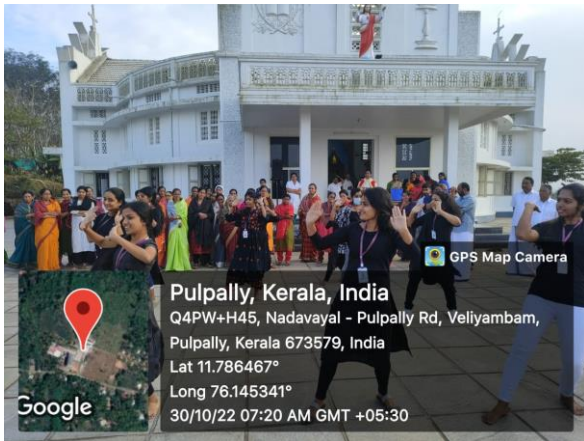
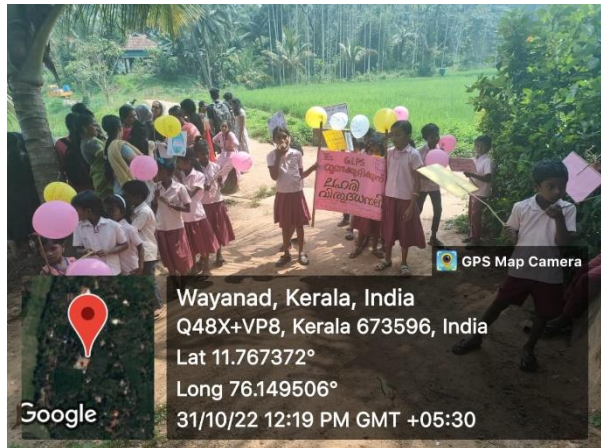
From the last Grama Saba meeting held at the adopted villages, we came to know that drug abuse among youth is a major concern of the community people because it has serious negative consequences on their health, education and overall well-being. From the interactions with the teachers in the schools of adopted villages, our students found that the drug abuse could interfere with school or work, as well as relationships with friends and family. In addition, drug abuse is linked to a variety of social problems, such as crime, domestic violence, and child abuse. In this scenario, awareness against drug abuse plays an important role.

Brief Description

Raising awareness about the dangers of drug abuse is important because it can help youngsters to make informed decisions about drug use and encourage them to seek help if they are struggling with substance abuse. By keeping this in mind, various education campaigns and community events were organized at the various places of the adopted villages.

1. An awareness rally was organized from Pulpally Panchayat Office to Pulpally Bus Stand followed by a Street-Play which was intended to promote awareness against drug abuse.
2. An awareness rally followed by a Street Play to create awareness on Drug Abuse was conducted at Thazhekappu Colony with the students of GLP School Mundakuttikkunnu, Pulpally.
3. The next activity related to it was a visit to Kripalayam Special School and formed a human chain by both the students of college and the students of Kripalayam Special School against Drug abuse followed by a Street-play.







ACTIVITY 04: Awareness class on good touch and bad touch (02/11/2022)

Need of the Activity:

From the interactions with the village people, we came to know that the tribal students are lacking knowledge in various topics that is essential for their day-to-day life activities.

Brief Description

Conducting awareness campaigns in the villages with the help of students and government officials was one of the activities planned in the Gram Sabha meeting. Through awareness campaigns, we can provide accurate and up-to-date information about the risks and consequences of the problems facing by the community people. This can help people make informed decisions about the issues and encourage them to seek help if they are struggling with any kind of issues. By keeping this in mind, an awareness class on good touch and bad touch was conducted for the students of the GLP School Mundakuttikkunnu, Pulpally by the college students. By this Awareness class, we helped students to reduce stigma by promoting a more understanding and compassionate approach to this topic and at the end, we provide information about where to find help for such kind of issues if happens. This can make it easier for the students to access the help they need.





ACTIVITY 05: A craft making tutorials for students (31/10/2022)

Need of the Activity:

From the Gram Sabha meeting we got a suggestion that the students should have some activities which they can do in their leisure time. In this, we planned to conduct some craft tutorials in the surrounding schools in the adopted villages.

Brief Description:

A craft tutorial for the tribal students of the Devi Vilasam Vocational Higher Secondary School, Veliyambam. Pulpally was organized by the students of St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) Devagiri. In this, the students were taught to make paper bags, paper pens and paper flowers.



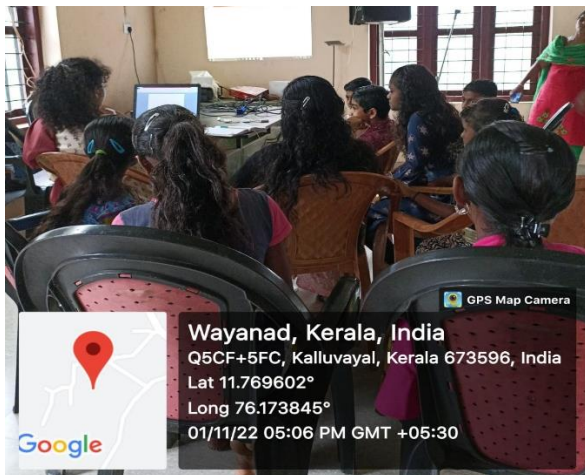


ACTIVITY 06: Computer Literacy programme (01/11/2022)

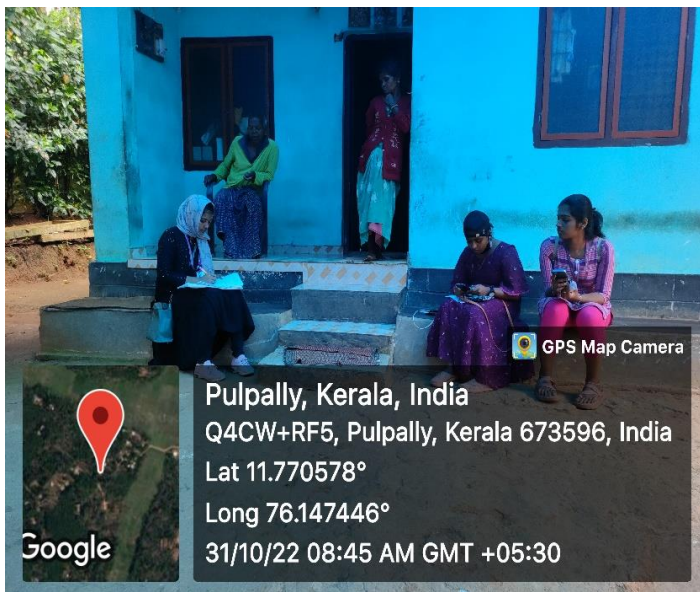
ACTIVITY 07: Health Survey and Medical Checkup camp (31 Oct, 1&2 Nov 2022)

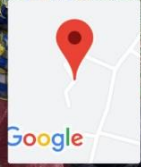
Need of the Activity:

To understand the health condition of the village people students conducted a survey among the villagers of the adopted villages. For this, they have organized a medical checkup camp to.

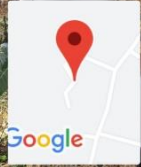
Brief Description:

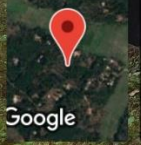
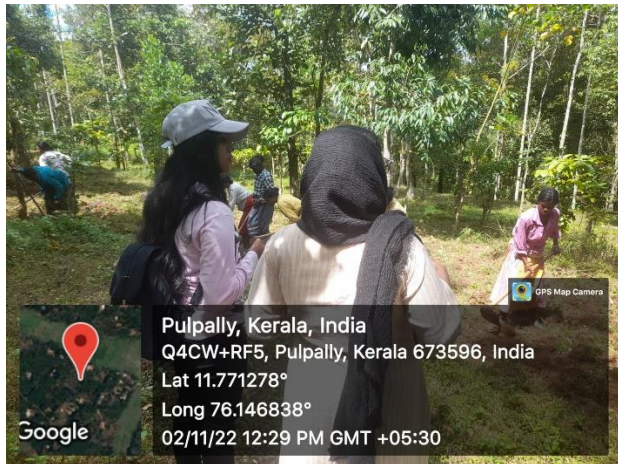




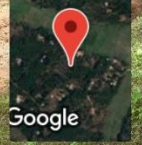
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ACTIVITY 08: Training in farming and making a small vegetable garden at the school premises in the adopted village (02/11/2022)

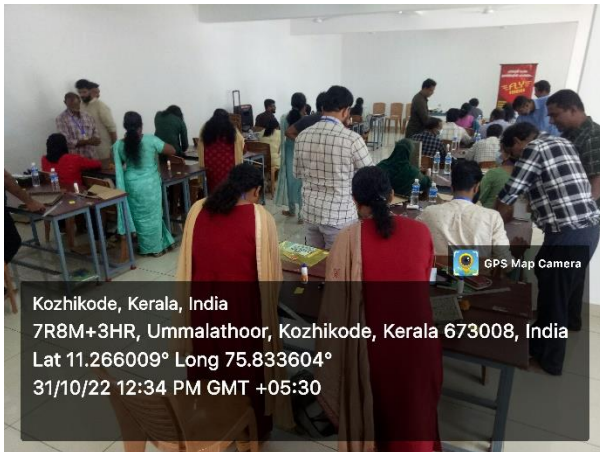
ACTIVITY 10: Workshop on paper bag making (31/10/2022)

Need of the Activity:

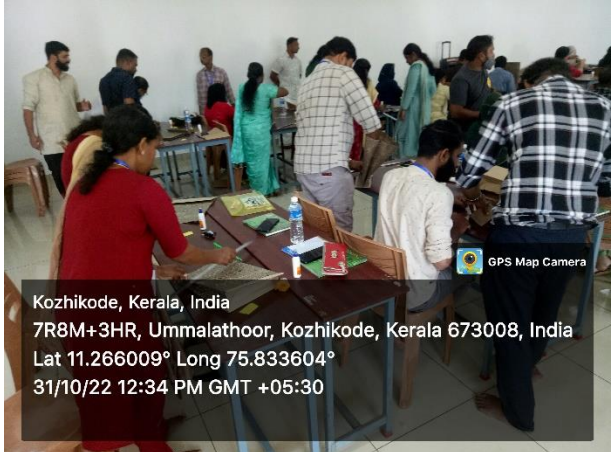
Introduction and training of some income generation means was an expressed need of the community people in the adopted villages.

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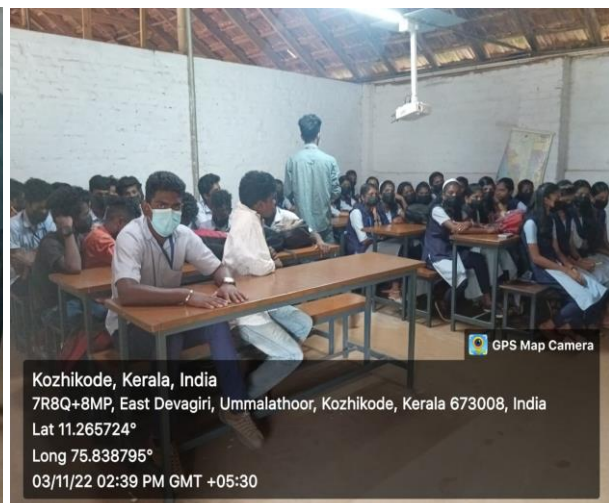
ACTIVITY 11: Career Guidance class (31 Oct & 03 Nov 2022)

There are many homeless, or rough sleepers, in the district in which the college campus is included, who have found a safe roof above their head amid Covid-19 pandemic through the Udayam home Project. The brainchild of Kozhikode District Collector S Seeram Sambasiva Rao IAS, the project under the district administration's Udaayam Charitable Society aims at the comprehensive rehabilitation of street dwellers, homeless, destitute and adult orphans. The unique initiatives started as a camp to keep street dwellers and homeless off the streets during the initial days of Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent lockdown in March last year. At first, the homeless were shifted to a camp setup after to three temporary houses.

They provide psychological care and job training and decent accommodation facilities. As part of job training, they have provided some cent of land for cultivation. The authority asked helping hand from the college students and this request is considered under the auspicious of UBA project and finished the work by the 09th of the December 2021.

The ninety NSS volunteers from St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) wholeheartedly accepted their request and showed a helping hand towards them. They finished the work within one day and turned the place into a cultivation friendly land.
